



## **EWZSA Slush Cup**

### **U11 Boardless Indoor Soccer Rule Modifications**

All Outdoor FIFA/IFAB Laws of the game apply (including off side at the half) with the following EWZSA modifications:

#### **Law 1 – The Field of Play**

- The field dimensions are determined by the facility used and marked accordingly, using modified markings depending on the facility.

#### **Law 2 – The Ball**

- The game ball shall be size 4

#### **Law 3 – The Players**

- A match is played by two teams, 7v7 Including Goalies
- The minimum number to start or continue a match will be 5 players.

#### **Law 5 – The Referee**

- The match will be officiated 2 referees each taking one half of the field.

#### **Law 7 – The Duration of the match**

- 2 - 25 minute halves and a 2 minute halftime.
- There is no allowance for time lost. No timeouts permitted.

#### **Law 8- The Start and Restart of Play**

- The opponents of the team taking the Kick-off must be at least 5 yards away

#### **Law 9 – The Ball In and Out of Play**

- Normal ball in and out of play principles apply from the Laws of the Game, relating to boundary lines or when the game is stopped by the referee.
- The ball is also out of play when it touches the ceiling or building structure overhanging the field of play. The restart will be a throw in to the opponents of the player who last touched the ball, at the touchline closest to where the ball touched the ceiling.

#### **Law 11 – Offside**

- The offside rule is in effect in the attacking 3rd of the field. This line may be marked as a dotted line, and solid line or single cones or flags on the touch line

## **Law 12 – Fouls and Misconduct**

- Spitting on the field is a Caution.
- All yellow offences are to be recorded by the referee on the applicable game sheet. No further discipline is applied.
- For red card offences the player cannot play for the remainder of the game, but will be allowed to stay with their team on the sideline. No further discipline is applied.

## **Law 13 – Free Kicks**

- Until the ball is in play, all opponents must remain at least 5 yards from the ball, unless they are on their own goal line between the goal posts

## **Law 16 – Goal Kick**

- At the taking of a goal kick, all players from the opposing team will retreat back behind the line (marked by painted line or cones) at the 1/3 mark of the field, which will also be known as the retreat line. Players from the opposing team may not pass the retreat line until the ball has been touched by the player receiving the goal kick. If the goal kick is kicked past the retreat line the ball is deemed in play as soon as it crosses the retreat line. If an opposing player passes the retreat line before the ball is deemed in play, then the goal kick will be retaken.
